### 6. Notes

Note 1	Diagnosis  Evidence confirming the diagnosis must be attached and forwarded with this application. Medical evidence should include a comprehensive medical history and the results of all relevant examinations, laboratory investigations and imaging studies. Copies of the original reports or letter should be included when possible. Evidence should be as objective as possible in the clinical circumstances, and in the case of non-demonstrable conditions, independent supporting medical opinion will assist this application.
Note 2	Anti-Doping Organisation Specify the name of the anti-doping organisation (ADO) to which you have previously submitted a TUE request. The ADO may be FIFA or your national anti-doping organisation, which could be either your national Olympic committee or another designated body.
	FA Chief Medical Officer  Where possible, the Chief Medical Officer (CMO) of your national football association should be notified of your TUE application to UEFA. When appropriate, the application should include a statement from the CMO attesting to the necessity of the otherwise prohibited substance or prohibited method in the treatment of the player.
